The County Board of Education and the County Superintendent of Schools encourage representatives of private industry to participate with the San Diego County Office of Education in preparing students in San Diego County for challenges they will meet in the future. Working together as partners, business and the San Diego County Office of Education should seek to educate citizens who can contribute to the productive workforce on which our economy depends.

The County Superintendent of Schools or his/her designee shall work with local employers to:

1. Serve on advisory committees.
2. Help design regular education, vocational, and technical programs.
3. Provide needs assessments, program evaluations, and/or staff development.

Businesses may also provide classroom assistance, individual tutoring, principal-for-a-day programs, incentive and recognition programs, work-experience opportunities, apprenticeship programs, and employment.

The County Board of Education also encourages private industry to contribute funds and equipment, and make donations and grants to further the San Diego County Office of Education educational programs. To prepare for an increasingly technological job market, students especially need access to equipment that meets current business standards.

The County Superintendent of Schools may recommend those individuals and/or businesses whose contributions merit County Board of Education recognition, commendation, or award.
